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Kings World Trust for Children was founded in 1994 to provide a caring home, an education and skills training for orphan and homeless children in southern India. Initially the Trust ran Children's Homes and an Outreach programme but has now refocused on providing a first class education at Kings School for bright children from very low income families and children with physical disabilities

KINGS SCHOOL

Kings Schools (Boarding and Day students) are self funding schools operated by Kings World Trust for Children. They provide a mainstream education in English for children of all backgrounds, religions and Indian castes. There are two Kings schools, Kings Matriculation School which follows the Tamil Nadu Common Syllabus and Kings CBSE School which teaches the Central Government Secondary syllabus. Both schools take students from Kindergarten up to Plus two examinations (3 to 18 years).

King Schools targets 40% of places at Kings for bright students from very low income or low caste Indian families and children with physical disabilities. These students pay no fees or low fees depending on family circumstances.



MEDICAL SUPPORT

KWTC provides a community based programme which supports 50 children with severe physical and mental disabilities in their own homes. These families are given financial support and receive medical support from a specialist medical charity located close to KWTC .



Kings Matriculation and CBSE Schools are located on a 55 acre rural campus near Vallioor in southern Tamil Nadu State. The campus has excellent and comprehensive facilities and resources for academic studies and for music, art, community service, cultural activities and sport. Kings Schools prepares all students for their future lives in modern India and most go on to University to provide a sustainable future for themselves and their families.

VOLUNTEERS / INTERNS

KWTC operates an Intern programme which attracts skilled and unskilled Interns of all ages. Interns currently come from the UK, Ireland, USA and Australia. The only requirement is English and a commitment to working with disadvantaged children from a different culture. Interns make a very valuable contribution to the work of Kings in India.



EDUCATION OUTREACH CARE

The Education Outreach care programme supports disadvantaged children from low income families in their own homes providing they remain in full- time education. Children in Outreach Care all attend full-time education mainly at local schools and colleges where Tamil is the first language. Children join this KWTC programme aged 4-10 years and remain in Outreach Care until they have completed University, Polytechnic or skills training and have started their own careers.
